The input received during these engagement components directly informed the development of the chapters and recommendations.






Would you like to see retail and services in these locations? Refer to the map below if you are not familiar with the historic village locations.

- bring in a dollar tree or dollar general
- Rt 4 is the place it makes the most sense to put businesses, but traffic/ getting out into traffic is tough. Extending the turn lane would be helpful.
- Before any more business comes to Rt 4 one must consider a full turn lane the whole way threw town. Now how's that going to effect the homes that sit almost on Rt 4 already?
- After doing the survey this appears to have more to do with bringing business to Northwood. Am I right? We are actually a "bedroom town" for surrounding Towns and Cities that had the room to already develop factories, markets, hotels, where much employment is unneeded. We are not a far away commute to these surrounding businesses. So encourage mroe rental property to be built 1 or 2 betrooms, thus keeping large amounts of students from over flowing our school. Even encourage over 55 small, compact, ranch (one level) homes to encourage more seniors to settle here. We have the lake, walking trails, library, churches, mabe a golf course someday to help attract over 65. More seniors would add to the existing Ambulance load though. PS Hope you can read my hand writing.
- Spread businesses around.
- Route 4 seems like the logical space to increase business growth. The roads off of Rt. 4 are quite rural and it would be nice to keep them that way as much as possible. Low impact businesses such as hairdressers, B+B's, small shops in people's home would be good on the side roads.
- Rather than tearing down old homes or bulldozing open land it seems that staying adjacent to existing
 businesses would help preserve the character of our town as folks drive on through to their destination. I
 would like to see a bus route between Concord and Portsmouth wiht stops and parking in Northoow. This
 might help some with Route 4 congestion as well as give folks a chance to get to those places without
 their vehicle.
- A centrally located set of shops would be a big addition.
- I would really like to see walkability improved. It would be nice to be able to bike or walk to places. Being able to walk or bike on the main route (safely) should be an option.
- I feel it is important to maintain Northwoods historic areas and small-town feel. There's already a
 wonderful history of independently owned shops, such as antique dealers, and it would be great to have
 additional small businesses to maintain that atmosphere. Like a destination... Spend the day in
 Northwood kind of thing.
- Traffic congestion and safety is a big challenge along Route 4 and lacks sufficient turn lanes. If this isn't
 considered then it is going to get even worse.
- More commercial development along Rte. 4 and improvements to Rte. 4 by the state will slow the traffic down and provide a destination town instead pass through town. Need an anchor busy that will bring people to the town, like the Christmas Dove for Barrington or Lee Circle and Epsom development area

- I chaired the Northwood Economic Development Committee years ago and located the land in which the HUD elderly housing complex is located on Bow Street. I wrote the successful final grant that brought in the \$3.1 million dollars for 31 elderly housing units. As a Selectman, I worked to help bring in the Hannaford grocery store. I held an S.O.S. (Save our Supermarket) at town hall and was able to collect over 700 signatures from residents and presented them to the Army Corps of Engineers because a few misinformed individuals were trying to stop food and medicine from coming into Northwood.

- It would be great to have a town center away from route 4 that would offer walkable shops, entertainment, restaurants, etc.

- Safe water is a big concern in town
- Northwood is well developed. There is no need to turn it into a strip mall.
- Northwood is a drive through commuter town now. Rt 4 is the limiting factor for economic development.
- we live in Northwood because we like a small town.
- We don't need more pkg lots and empty places of business bc businesses don't succeed. Leave northwood as it is.
- I have looked into what's involved for my wife to start a single chair hair salon out of our home as she currently works in Dover. The amount of paperwork and money needed to hire engineers and land consultants to meet the major site plan requirements was overwhelming and we gave up. I feel that the major site plan being required for her to work out of our home is excessive.
- Route 4 is a highly traveled road and retail and restaurants would do well. We need to have our inspectors and zoning more business-friendly.
- I like the current mix of locally owned business and services available in Northwood. Larger businesses and national chains would not be appropriate for this town.
- It would be great if there could be something of a small town 'main street' in Northwood that could feel like more of a town center than route 4. And more rec/community options for families:). Also love that the trails, nature, and local farms/products seems to be a focus for Northwood and would love for that to continue to be central to planning for the town.
- The fact that Rte 4 is a "major" transportation route from seacoast to northern NH is a double edged sword. When and wherever possible businesses and residences should be encouraged to limit access to Rte 4 by backing onto the travel way (turn arounds, circular driveways). Backing out onto Rte 4 is dangerous! Dont know if State regulations prohibit but some better makings for right hand turn lane for rte 43 east bound on rte 4 might reduce the number of incidents when traffic begins the turn well before beginning of turning lane.
- High taxes with little benefit and weak town services. If my family wasn't here, I'd move.
- Coe Brown and a bunch of lakes are the only things that keep this town alive, despite the town constantly
 messing everything up.
- I'm retired so much of this is NA although I don't want to see a lot of commercial development here. I think the divisive nature of the town per FB chat page is a big factor reflective of our nation. One side won't typically support a business that is "radical" in the opposite of your personal stance. I'm grateful for choices nearby (such as 7C in Strafford) and am concerned with overdevelopment. Look at Epsom. There has to be some rural flavor kept and the greed of the elite should be kept at bay. It's not all money. Joni Mitchell was on to something. You don't know what you've got till it's gone. I would like to see bus routes to major cities perhaps at Park and Ride and town hall.

- . Tif district was passed as a warrant article nothing was ever done maybe its worth looking back into


